SAFEGUARDING CURRICULUM
OVERVIEW

'At Fritchley CE **Primary and Nursery** School we learn and achieve together within a safe, respectful and welcoming Christian community. Our children's spiritual and moral development is nurtured by our values, enabling them to fulfil their potential and giving them the confidence needed to be lifelong learners and problem solvers in the wider world.'

Pupil safeguarding and the promotion of Christian values are at heart of Fritchley CofE (Aided) Primary and Nursery School. Great importance is placed on identifying opportunities in the taught curriculum for children to learn about safeguarding. Our broad curriculum gives pupils opportunities to experience life in all its diversity, to acquire knowledge, understanding and skills that significantly impact on personal development, behaviour and welfare and equips every child with the knowledge and skills required for personal safeguarding. Our planned and sequenced PSHE curriculum covers all areas of Safeguarding and builds on prior learning through each of the strands to a different degree, however some go into more detail. We are sensitive in our teaching and recognise that some of the more sensitive subjects need to be taught at an age appropriate level, in a small group or 1:1 level where a more urgent need arises.

We plan to regularly challenge children to think deeply about safeguarding matters and their own personal physical and mental wellbeing. We value pupils' questions and give them space for their own thoughts, ideas and concerns. We give them opportunities across the curriculum and in the community to explore values, personal rights, their own self-worth, responsibilities and equal opportunities along with problem solving to develop moral concepts that impact positively on safeguarding, promote British values and prevent radicalisation and extremism. There are many opportunities throughout our learning in school to explore safeguarding issues:

- · Road safety (including out of school visits, bikeability, work with police officers from the community)
- · Poolside and water safety through swimming lessons
- · Fire awareness (including visits from the local fire service) Year 1/2 and Year 5/6
- · Healthy eating health visitors
- · Visitors from charities such as NSPCC to do focused projects
- · Work around safe transition to Secondary school
- \cdot Videos /lessons such as Mr Shapeshifter/pantosaurus
- · What to do if you are separated from your group (in relation to school visits)
- · Online safety
- · Online well-being

Online Safety
